## Three congregations dismissed

The presbytery said good-bye to three congregations who have completed the process outlined in the Presbytery of New Covenant's **Reconciliation and Discernment** Procedures.

The congregation of Memorial PC, San Augustine, was dismissed to the Evangelical Presbyterian Church and will be received as a member congregation of Central South Presbytery, pending completion of the transfer to that body.

Advent PC, Spring, has completed the same process and was dismissed to another Reformed body, the Covenant Order of Evangelical Presbyterians (ECO). ECO Presbytery of the West will assume ecclesiastical authority over the church, pending completion of the transfer to that body.

And, the congregation of First PC, Lake Jackson, has completed the process as outlined and was dismissed to the Evangelical Presbyterian Church and will be received as a member congregation of Central South Central South Presbytery, pending completion of the transfer to that body.

The presbytery prayed with and for these congregations as they enter a new phase of their ministry in the name of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.
