# Blest Be The Tie That Binds







It has been one year since Hurricane Harvey devastated the Houston area. Think of all the threats facing us each year, such as hurricanes, tornados, flooding, winter weather, fire, acts of terror, and many more.

How are you going to handle that disaster? A year after Harvey, what is it you wish you knew then or had done then that would have made it a little easier to handle the chaos?

The Missions Team wanted to make "Disaster Preparedness" the topic for this month's mission focus because of those very reasons. Therefore, during the month of September, our team would like to share some tips and resources from the City of Houston, the Harris County Homeland Security & Emergency Management, and Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA) to assist you in being prepared for the next disaster. PDA is one of the benevolences our church supports.

To begin with, there are *4 steps* you can take to better ensure your family's safety in case of an emergency.

- 1. **Make a plan** Each family is unique. Sit down together and decide how you will get in contact with each other, where you will go, and what you will do in an emergency. We will include one of many samples to use during the first week of September.
- Build a kit Building a family emergency kit is crucial. During emergencies, you may need to be on your own for a period of time. You may want to consider three types of kits: A Go-Bag, a Shelter-in-Place Kit, and a Pet Disaster Supply Kit. We will include resources for your use during the second week of September.
- 3. **Stay informed** Staying informed in an emergency situation may be different than normal, especially when there is no electricity or telephone reception. During the third week of September we will share some resources for receiving emergency alerts, notifications, and other information in the Houston area.
- 4. Know your neighbors Your neighbors can be a great source of help immediately after a disaster. By knowing your neighbors ahead of time, and discussing any special needs you or they may have, will allow your community to work better as a team when disasters strike. The fourth week of September we will share some resources that may help get you prepared.

We will be posting this information on the church's website, the Friday emails, and the Narthex bulletin board. We will also be including weekly tips in the Sunday worship bulletins. We hope these tools will help you become better prepared for the next disaster.

FYI... Our own Carol Davis is a Certified Disaster Trainer for New Covenant Presbytery.

### **September Mission Opportunities**

*School Supplies* – Thank you to all that donated school supplies in July for CUPS (Comunidades Unidas Pro Salud, which means Communities United for Health) and PCHAS (Presbyterian Children's Homes and Services). We collected a total of 147 items for CUPS and 286 items for PCHAS, which totaled 433 school supply items.


is always good to have back up! Please RSVP to <u>ethan@springbranchpres.org</u> if you plan to attend.

#### INTERESTED IN A BIBLE STUDY USING ZOOM CONFERENCE CALL ONCE A MONTH??

Can't attend the PW Circle meetings on the second Wednesdays of the month at members' homes or at church? Here's an alternative:

Interested women may join a Zoom conference call to discuss the Bible study lesson each month using their computer or phone! A computer, laptop, tablet, or smart phone with a camera and mike are needed in order to see all those in the meeting and any documents shown on the screen. If a participant does not have this, she can join the meeting using her regular phone. She will be able to talk and hear everyone, but would need printed materials that will be discussed. Zoom provides video and audio in conference calls that include screen sharing, e.g., documents, video.

The 2018-2019 "Horizons" Bible study is *God's Promise: I Am With You* by Amy Poling Sutherlun, Co-pastor of FPC in San Marcos, TX. She also made the companion DVD to go with this study which can be used in the Zoom meeting. This study is readily adaptable for discussion of the focus of the promise and how it speaks into particular circumstances---and into *our* circumstances. There are nine lessons on topics such as God with Us Wherever We Are, God with Us in Our Discouragement, God with Us When We Seek God, God with Us When We're Powerless, etc.

Are you interested in finding out more about a new way of approaching Bible Study? Through the use of an on-line program called ZOOM we will be able to do a bible study online. The group can determine when meetings will be each month, depending on availability of participants for that month. No driving to the meeting, no child care needed, can be scheduled at times for the working women. If you are using your camera with your computer. all you have to do is comb your hair and straighten up what is directly behind you since it will show on the screen to others!!

You are invited to a informational meeting of potential Zoom participants on Sunday September 9th at 10:30 AM in the Parlor. The purpose of the meeting will be to demonstrate Zoom and plan the first Zoom Bible Study Meeting. The first ZOOM session will be the first lesson in our Horizon Bible Study and will be facilitated by Patti Nanney later in September. 
