From The Pastor—Camouflaged Christians

Dear members and friends,

Ever see a bug or animal that was hardly distinguishable from its surroundings?

Camouflage is a God-given gift that increases an animal's chances of survival in the wild by helping it to blend in with its surroundings. This way it can hide itself from predators. With all of the news today about modern warfare, I am sure you have seen the various camouflage schemes used to conceal an entire army from its enemies. This, too, helps ensure survival. It enhances the prospect of success.

Camouflage can be a wonderful thing...except in the church. In fact, for us as Christians, it will work in reverse. Here is what I mean: an animal needs to hide in order to survive. A church which is hidden will surely die. An army needs to cloak itself in order to bring success. A church which is clandestine will fail.

This does not mean that when we follow Christ we do so merely for "show." Jesus teaches that if this is our motivation, we already have our reward (Matthew 6:1). Yet, it is equally true that the world in which we live increasingly needs to see the church faithfully living out the good news if it is going to believe the message of hope.

It is often said that Presbyterians are much better at showing the gospel than they are at telling it. Maybe, maybe not. I do know that one without the other quickly becomes meaningless. Together they are a powerful combination!

One of the things that impresses me greatly about Spring Branch is the sense of family here, the loving acceptance of anyone who walks through our doors. I hope we will always be a church where we need not wear masks, and where we can share together in both our joys and our sorrows. There is community here, and for that I am so very thankful.

But, does our community know it? This is a question we must each answer. Did you know that we are only a couple of blocks from the world's widest freeway? How many notice us? What things about us are hidden? If we are camouflaged, it matters not how incredible our church family is. We will eventually lose our vigor and become inwardly focused. Jesus said it best when he said, "You are the light of the world. A city built on a hill cannot be hid. No one after lighting a lamp puts it under the bushel basket, but on the lampstand, and it gives light to all in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in heaven." (Matthew 5:14-16)

As we enter February and then prepare for Lent, may God help us to resist the temptation to be camouflaged Christians. And may Christ's light shine brightly through us to our community.

#### SBPC Celebrated the Installation of Rev. Dr. Kevin Boyd

The service began with a processional led by the Calabash Group from St. Paul Presbyterian Church, followed by the members of the Installation Committee: Rev. Lynn Hargrove, General Presbyter and Stated Clerk, who delivered the sermon; Rev. Helen DeLeon, Moderator with the Presbytery of New Covenant, who led offering and the Prayer of Installation; Rev. Fred Seay, Pastor at the First Presbyterian Church in Sugar Land; Rev. Mark Plunkett, Pastor with the Heritage Presbyterian Church; Elizabeth Power, Elder, SBPC; Travis Boyd, Elder with First Presbyterian Church in Sugar Land; and Barry Wilson, Elder at St. Paul Presbyterian Church. Hymns and music were led by Pastor Boyd and Barry Wilson on guitars, accompanied by Calabash, Mark Lewis, Sam Gowdy, Steve Arnold, and Atem Orock with vocals and instruments. The Installation Service ended with the Laying of the Hands on Pastor Boyd. Following the service, a delicious barbeque dinner was served with barbeque prepared by Pastor Boyd and Jim Kunkel and side dishes provided by the Fellowship Committee.

The collaborative effort that first year raised \$5,700, and the youth donated every penny to local charities.

Our church's Mission of the Month for February is the Souper Bowl of Caring. On February 3, we will once again be holding soup pots at the "Time for Young Disciples" and at the doors of our Sanctuary at the end of the Worship Service for a dollar or canned food or more. All donations will go to Fairhaven Food Pantry, which supports the hungry in the Spring Branch area.

Today, Souper Bowl of Caring is a movement of individuals, congregations, schools, scouts, and eight NFL teams caring for others on Super Bowl weekend. More than \$143 million has been raised in monetary and food donations since 1990, and 100% of all donations go directly to food banks, soup kitchens and other charities across the country.

Souper Bowl of Caring brings people together to help those in need across the country, while transforming the time around the Super Bowl into the nation's largest celebration of giving and serving. Remember, we can make a big difference when we all come together.

Jesus' words: "I was hungry and you gave me food, thirsty and you gave me drink....whenever you did this for one of the least of these followers of mine, you did it for me!"




Here is a list of things to do for special people:



However we choose to celebrate, it should include everyone we care about.










#### Annual report of Presbyterian Women of Spring Branch Presbyterian Church to Presbyterian Women's Organization New Covenant Presbytery



The Presbyterian Women (PW) of Spring Branch Presbyterian Church (SBPC) is active in many diverse ways. Wednesday is considered church day by many. On the first Wednesday of the month, the Bible Moderators' training is held, led by our pastor, then followed by the PW Board meeting. Our Bible Study Circle meets on the second Wednesday of the month, meeting in homes some months and at the church other times. Moderating is shared by members with about 10-15 in attendance. This year, Carol Davis helped organize a night time Bible Study using ZOOM. Sometimes it is led by a member, and other times the PW study CD is used. We

have 5-6 participating. We have an evening group called the UNWIND circle which meets on a Monday evening of each month at local restaurants with about 10 women gathering for fellowship. The third Wednesday is reserved for our ZIPS – We zip around town on field trips that include shopping at outlet malls, touring museums, and visiting other fun places. During the year, there are several UNZIP trips that occur on days other than Wednesdays. On the 4<sup>th</sup> Wednesday, we have Happy Hands/Common Threads at which time we stuff and sew pillows. In 2018, our women alone donated 1808 articles including heart pillows, knitted and crocheted baby caps, baby booties, scarves, and blankets. All are delivered to Houston hospitals for babies, children, cancer patients etc. We are involved with others from Memorial Drive Methodist Church and the community to continue this mission. We have active members who are involved with Presbyterian Children's Homes and Services (PCHAS) and their annual luncheon in Houston. This year we hosted four tables with over 40 guests at the luncheon. We also send a birthday card to each child at these facilities with a crisp \$1 bill and care packages to college students associated with PCHAS. The PW has organized collections of household items for the PCHAS Single Parent Homes in Houston, as well as back packs, overnight bags, and small suitcases filled with toiletries for PCHAS foster children. Our church delivers Hot Meals on the fourth Saturday of the month. The women drive one of the months. We have College Connection, where a member of the church is paired with a college student, some from PCHAS and others of our own congregation. The member is to pray for and send cards to the college student. Our College Connection coordinator sends a care package two times a year to these students. Our PW has its own scholarship/mission fund in conjunction with the Presbyterian Men for men and women of our congregation that are in financial need or in college. Each spring, we give to men and women attending college, graduate school, or pursuing of other educational degrees. To fund this, on the fifth Wednesday nights of the school year, the PW cooks for Wednesday night supper. It is mission soup night, and all proceeds go toward our mission/scholarship fund. We also have a cookbook printed in 2014, the sixth edition of Friendship Cookbook, with proceeds going toward the scholarships. Whenever SBPC hosts a Presbytery meeting or the Spring Gathering of the Presbytery PW, any proceeds from serving lunch will also benefit the scholarship fund. Since 2006, we have given 31 scholarships totaling \$30,000. This fund also is used to help a member of the congregation who is in need of some financial support due to medical or other causes. Many of our women are involved in our annual "Dress a Girl" event at which time we make pillow case dresses that are delivered overseas to various countries or within the US. Many also participate in a women's day retreat sponsored by the Faith Development committee of the church.

Every August, we begin our year with a Welcoming Tea on a Sunday afternoon. This year it was a 30<sup>th</sup> Birthday celebration for the PW. The Bible study for the year is introduced. Guests are informed as to how they may be involved in the life of the church. The Table Hosts this year provided centerpieces remembering the PW though the years at SBPC with pictures of our scholarship recipients, pictures, dresses from a style show in the 80's, angel cookie cans from our past Cookie Galore sales, remembrances of those who have been with us in the past, pictures of past ZIP trips, Christmas in our sanctuary with the

Chrismon's made years ago by members, children's art, and Welcoming Tea parties. We held benefit drawings for many different donated prizes, all proceeds benefitting our scholarship fund. We have general meetings/lessons/salad and soup luncheons in September, December, and May.

Our membership is about 75. Those who do not attend Bible Study are involved with our fundraising, Wednesday night dinners, showers, and Welcoming Tea. This past year we lost three members, Pat Bederman, Dauris Galbreath, and Codie Hill.


#### **Donate Fabric and Yarn to Happy Hands**
