From The Pastor...

Greetings, members and friends of SBPC!

I want to begin by thanking you for the wonderful celebration we held during Holy Week, and especially Easter. It was truly wonderful to see the church come together to wave palm branches, learn of Christ's Last Supper through our Seder meal, commemorate Christ's death through our Tenebrae, pray earnestly for ourselves and for our church on Saturday's vigil, and finally, celebrate the resurrection of our Lord. And then we laughed at the irony of the greatest victory in the universe.

Yes, it was a busy season! I know that the tendency is to think that Easter is the pinnacle of the life of the church. But please consider this: On that first Resurrection morning, there were no filled pews. No one dressed up nicely. There were no egg hunts or nice dinners planned. Nothing... except to prepare a dead body. How different things are now!

The Easter season is 50 days long, which corresponds with the time between Passover and Pentecost, the Jewish feast marking the barley harvest. It was on that first Pentecost after Jesus rose from the dead that the church was truly born when the Holy Spirit was poured out upon the church. That is when the growth truly began.

Can we recapture this image today? Let me be clear: The church at Pentecost should be larger numerically than the church at Easter. What if the church truly understood this fundamental truth? What if we saw it happen this year?

Your pastor and session believe it can. It will happen as those upon whom the Holy Spirit has been poured out share the good news, as happened in Acts 2. Would you like to be part of this amazing celebration? I hope so. During the upcoming month I will be preaching on various aspects of hospitality and how we can practice them in our church. Then, on Pentecost, June 9, we are planning some great things! This would be a great time to put what we have learned into action. There will be a special worship service that culminates in a balloon release (yes they are biodegradable!), a picnic with barbecue, a kite flying contest, and more. Let's have a blast! And let's be sure to invite our friends and families to be present. This year, let's make sure that the church of Pentecost is even larger than the church of Easter.

The Mission of the Month for May is **Comunidades Unidas Pro Salud (CUPS)!** CUPS is a Christian organization founded in 1989 to improve the quality of life in rural communities along the Mexico-U.S. border. Maximizing the use of capital and human resources, CUPS unites mission trip volunteers with the people of Mexican and U.S. communities in projects that touch the lives of thousands of people. Health and education projects are a primary focus, and these are

designed to meet community defined needs. Other humanitarian projects and programs, such as disaster relief, are also important in the work for CUPS.

During the month of May, our church will be collecting the following items for CUPS:

Items for elderly

(Such as adult diapers, canes, walkers, crutches, bedside commodes, and wheelchairs)

School supplies

(Such as pencils, pens, crayons, colored markers, small scissors, construction paper, and story books in Spanish and English)

Old laptops & desktop computers

(One of their board members reworks and installs Spanish Microsoft Office products on them.)

All of the above can be left in the bins outside of the church office, in the Fellowship Hall, or in the Narthex. We will faithfully pick up these supplies and store them until we can get them to CUPS in McAllen.

In 2019, our church will give \$1,000/year to CUPS.






