#### From The Pastor...

Dear Members and Friends,

It is that time of year in Texas when it is just downright HOT! Walking outside to do even the smallest chore is an ordeal because of the heat. Our air conditioners strain to capacity to drive out the hot air and we try to do as many activities as possible indoors. Many things rise along with the temperatures. Our electric bills are at their annual peak. Parents' responsibilities soar as we get the kids back to class. One study told about another thing that rises when it gets hot... Our tempers! When the heat becomes oppressive, it seems to affect every corner of our lives.

How can we stay cool even in the heat? Perhaps you think I am talking about the traditional things like staying indoors and drinking fluids. These may be good suggestions, but I am referring to our spiritual lives. Difficult times can put a strain on our family and church relationships. The Bible actually does, I believe, give us some good advice on staying cool. Here is a sample of what I mean:

- 1. Love your enemies: "Yes, brother, let me benefit from you in the Lord; refresh my heart in Christ." Philemon 1:20. Paul is writing to Philemon concerning a slave who has wronged him. He says that seeing forgiveness will bring about a refreshing of his heart. Likewise, when we choose to forgive others for Christ's sake, it is like giving a cool drink to our thirsty souls. We become like Christ. We are refreshed.
- 2. Fellowship: "For they have refreshed my spirit and yours." 1 Cor. 16:18. Here, Paul speaks of the coming of Christian friends in his hour of need. As they came together in Christ, their spirits were refreshed, made cool and clean. Over the Summer months, do not neglect the resource of fellowship with other Christians. We experience God as we lift up each other in Christ. (See also 2 Timothy 2:15.)
- 3. Make a spiritual retreat a part of your plans: In Peter's sermon in Acts 3:19 he gives these words: "Repent, therefore, and return, that your sins may be wiped away, in order that times of refreshing may come from the presence of the Lord." The connection is clear. True refreshment in our lives can only come through the presence of the Lord. When we truly encounter God, we often find a need to change. God stands ready to forgive our sins, wipe the slate clean, and refresh us. Have you consciously set aside time to be with God? How about the refreshment that comes from a retreat? Or, perhaps you would like to attend a Pilgrimage or Walk to Emmaus. \*For more information on these, call me or see the church office.
- 4. Remember the Sabbath principle (Exodus 20:8-11): Sundays, the Lord's Days, are special days to Christians. As we keep them holy by rest and worship, we invite the blessing of God. No matter how hot it gets, this refreshment is always in order. Maximize your life by worshiping this week. See you Sunday!

PDA has also been helping many of our neighbors continue to recover from Hurricane Harvey. Spring Branch continues to work with the Presbytery of New Covenant and other churches throughout the area to help coordinate future recovery efforts. # September Mission Opportunities

**Life Line Screening** — Come participate in preventive health screening services are designed to identify risk factors that can lead to heart disease, stroke, and other serious illnesses. Life Line uses three non-invasive methods to get you lab-accurate results and recommendations you can review with your doctor. Life Line will be here on Saturday, September 7, from 8:30-5:30 in The Gathering Place.

**SBPC Hot Meals on Weekends** — The 4<sup>th</sup> Saturday of each month we look for individuals to deliver meals to shut-ins. We have 2 routes with about 14 people on each route, so we usually need a total of 4 volunteers each month. # **God gives us Wacky Warnings!**

This months' Messy Church is inspired by the Old Testament (books before Jesus) prophet Jeremiah and the book we have based on his messages to the Israelites before they were put into exile.

Jeremiah is a book that many churches will have as part of their scripture readings this fall, but it is not an easy one to break down and share with through games and activities! It was challenging for all of the leaders, perhaps because the message is challenging itself!

#### A few observations we made:

When God sent the prophet Jeremiah, even though he might be preaching doom and gloom, the messages always start with love. Not unlike a parent warning and even punishing a child, He did it because He loved them and wanted to protect them. It starts with love.

It's estimated that Jeremiah was about seventeen when he was called by God to start preaching to Israel. He was hesitant at first. We ourselves, adults and kids alike are also called to speak up and to correct injustices and we might also be tentative about that call. It's unlikely that our warnings will become a book of the Bible, but we do have a chance to speak up when we see something wrong, to "Say Something" as author Peter Reynolds put it.






