Dear members and friends,

One Sunday morning, a mother went in to wake her son and tell him it was time to get ready to go to church. He replied, "I'm not going." "Why not?" she asked. "I'll give you two reasons," he said. "One, they don't like me, and two, I don't like them."

His mother replied, "I'll give YOU two good reasons why you SHOULD go to church. One, you're 54 years old, and two, you're the pastor!"

Well sometimes fellowship in any church can be a bit complex. And yet, mom still had the right idea. It is worth it. Part of the difficulty and the beauty lie in the fact that God did not make us identical to each other. Even identical twins can have widely different world views. There are not two people who share the same opinion on anything. And yet, by a great miracle, God gathers us together into this body of believers we call the church.

One good example of this difference is the project I did with your hymn requests. This was my chance to get to know you and to find out what is meaningful to you musically. To date, we have had two very different hymn sing Sundays with music requested by YOU. And for over two months now, the music has been entirely your requests. I hope you have enjoyed it as I have. It highlights how very different our tastes can be. But isn't that how it is in the Kingdom?

In Matthew 13:52, Jesus is describing the Kingdom of Heaven to the religious folks. He has this very unusual observation: "...the kingdom of heaven is like a head of a household, who brings forth out of his treasure things new and old."

I find this description to be full of promise. First, the Kingdom is full of treasure. As the mom above believed, being active in the fellowship is important and worth it. Even more, there is a treasure for all who will be devoted to it.

Second, notice it is the head of the household who bring forth a variety. The question is not IF God wants the church to have a variety of people. God is bringing them to our doorstep. The real question, however, is if we are willing to embrace people whose views who may not be identical to ours. And yet the master seems to take great joy in pointing out that these are all brought forth by his gracious hand.

Finally, I think it is important to note (and this was Jesus' main point) that the real treasure lies in combining the old with the new. I am very aware that each of us has our own personal tastes in music and some are quite diametrically opposed. Yet, I look over our list of hymn requests and I see it as a treasure chest. There are songs many of us sang long ago, hymns standard to our church, and new spiritual worship songs of a new generation of believers. Christ calls this entire combination a treasure. Will we?

I want to thank each of you who participated in letting me know which musical selections are meaningful to you. My hope and prayer as we gather together in worship, is that we will learn to respect and to embrace one another's styles, and that our church will always be open to the new work of the Holy Spirit. **SBPC Hot Meals on Weekends** – The 4<sup>th</sup> Saturday of each month we look for individuals to deliver meals to shut-ins. We have 2 routes with about 14 people on each route, so we usually need a total of 4 volunteers each month. **Presbyterian Pan American Choir** – The choir will be performing for us on Sunday, October 6, for World Communion Sunday and we are looking for host families for the kids to stay with while they are here. The choir members will stay in pairs with their host families, so we are looking for approximately 12 host families who can host choir members for Saturday night, October 5. They will have dinner at the church on Saturday night and the host families will feed them breakfast on Sunday morning. **Feed My Starving Children** – Our church is partnering again with Pines Presbyterian to provide food for Feed My Starving Children. This organization packages meals that are distributed both locally and worldwide to combat malnutrition. On Friday and Saturday, October 11 &12, we will be packaging food to be sent out. **MAM Back-to-School Drive Update** – a special thank you to everyone that donated to our Annual MAM Back-to-School Uniform Voucher Drive! Anyone who works with our children, youth, or people with disabilities is currently required to take the Child Protection Policy training every two years.

#### This includes:

- all SBPC paid staff,
- all Teaching Elders,
- all active Ruling Elders,
- · all Academy paid staff,
- · all Academy volunteers,
- all Christian Education/Faith Development and Worship volunteers,
- and any group or organization, such as Boy Scouts or Girl Scouts, wanting to use our church property for more than a one-time event must also take the Child Protection Policy training.

Training will be offered three times during the month of October:

- Sunday, October 13: Join us for our monthly birthday celebration before the training; lunch provided.
- Wednesday, October 16: Bring your Wednesday Night Supper to the Conference Room at 6:30.
- Tuesday, October 22: Join us at 6:00 before our monthly session meeting. Light snacks provided.






