The “Mission of the Month” for November is one of our favorite ministries at Spring Branch Presbyterian – the Houston International Seafarers Center. The Seafarers Center is a multi-denominational outreach to seafarers from around the world who dock at terminals in the Houston Ship Channel.

Imagine working on a ship, far from home, as Christmas approaches. This is reality for countless seafarers who pass through the Port of Houston every day. As the Port Chaplains share a

Christmas shoebox with each seafarer, the seafarers experience true joy and excitement. Each Christmas approximately 11,000 Christmas boxes are provided free of charge to our visiting Seafarers.

Our goal this year is to provide 100 decorated shoeboxes filled with many useful items to the Seafarers Center.

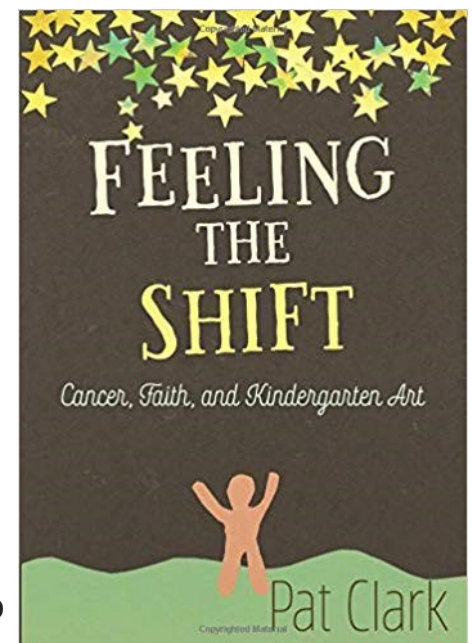


**DISCUSSION ON "FEELING THE SHIFT: CANCER, FAITH, AND KINDERGARTEN ART" BY REV. PAT CLARK

Through contact with each of the families, we determine items that the children need or want. In addition to two gifts designated from the parent, each child receives a gift from SBPC. Each family also receives a generous food basket. We will be collecting nonperishable kid-friendly foods for these baskets, so watch for collection bins outside the church office. Tags will be available beginning on Sunday, December 8, before and after worship, and also on Wednesday, December 11 at dinner. Be sure to pick up one or two!

Here’s what you do: select an angel tag (or two). Purchase the gift (in the \$20 price range). Wrap the gift, sticking the tag to the front of the package. Return the gift to the church office no later than Sunday, December 15.
