

Greetings, friends and members of Spring Branch Presbyterian Church!

I pray that this finds you well and that you are enjoying the blessings of our Lord. A special thank you to all who have been part of our "drive-in" services lately. Your participation has made the events fun and inspiring. Many people are asking when we will be returning to worshiping in person. The answer is a little complicated, but here is the word of your Elders as of today:

- 1. We will be resuming worship in the Sanctuary on Sunday, June 14.
- 2. Social distancing will be in effect.
- 3. An Usher will seat all worshipers an appropriate distance from one another, with family groups being allowed to sit together.
- 4. The first several rows will not be used, so that there will be adequate distance from both the Pulpit and Lectern.
- 5. Entrances, exits, and ways to the rest rooms will be mapped out and explained to all worshipers before entering worship.
- 6. All worshipers will be asked to wear masks and sanitize their hands prior to entering worship. Hand sanitizer and a limited number of masks will be available, so worshipers are asked to bring their own if possible.
- 7. There will be no choir for the time being, due to concerns about distancing and the possible increased spread of contamination while singing.
- 8. In place of congregational singing, music will be led in such a way that congregants may participate while masked if they choose.
- 9. There will be no Time For Young Disciples as we have known it, until we are cleared to do so.
- 10. We will not shake hands, hug, or otherwise touch during the worship service.
- 11. No refreshments will be served and water fountains will not be available. Worshipers may feel free to bring bottled water.
- 12. Sunday School classes will continue online, until we learn that it is safe to meet in person.
- 13. There will be no Nursery yet, though hopefully this will be reinstated in the near future as the need arises.
- 14. Worshipers are encouraged to give online if possible. All offerings in the service will be collected in such a way that no touch is involved.
- 15. The service will also be broadcast over Facebook Live. We urge anyone who may be at a high risk to please continue worshiping with us in this manner until it is safe to do so.

I find it amazing that these guidelines need to be in place, although I think we do all understand. In addition, the CDC frequently changes information, so these guidelines may change to reflect them. In which case, we will notify everyone as quickly as possible.

Please do pray for your pastor, elders, and church staff, as we attempt to navigate these unfamiliar waters.

The mission of Houston: reVision (reVision) is to leverage the power of community by connecting kids on the edge with mentors, positive peers, and life-changing resources. reVision works with youth enmeshed at every point of the school to prison pipeline teens in trouble at school, in juvenile detention, on probation as well as 'certified' youth in adult prison. Intervening in the

lives of male and female youth of all ethnicities,

reVision has come into contact with hundreds of youth whose pathway into the criminal justice system began in their home schools, where they found themselves suspended, removed to alternative schools, and arrested and expelled. By connecting one kid at a time to caring adults, positive peers and a program that works, we offer disconnected youth the opportunity to revision hopeful pathways.



June Mission Updates & Opportunities

Missions during the COVID-19 Outbreak – As you can imagine, many of the typical Missions that we perform have been curtailed due to social distancing requirements in place to mitigate transmission of the virus. We have adapted to this and have changed the focus of our mission work to respond to needs arising from our current challenges. We have two initiatives now and are developing others.

- <u>Sewing masks for medical staff and first responders-</u> As you have all seen on the news, there is a critical national shortage of personal protective equipment for medical staff and first responders. We have a dedicated group, led by Kay Craig, who have taken upon themselves to sew masks to protect the people that take care of us. If you would like to help, please contact Kay.
- <u>Letters / Cards for medical staff and first responders-</u> These people work a lot of hours and are under an incredible amount of stress between patient concerns, long works hours, and concerns for their own families. While we cannot do a lot about these things, but we can offer written encouragement to them to help keep morale up. If you would like to participate, please contact Miguel Carlin.
- <u>Financial donations to Food Pantries in Spring Branch-</u> Due to the high rate of unemployment from the COVID-19 Outbreak, the Fair Haven and East Spring Branch Food Pantries have been seeing an unprecedented amount of traffic. We have decided to make monetary donations to each of these food pantries to assist them in serving more people in need during this difficult time. A total of 375 items were collected for the Fair Haven Food Pantry at our Drive-Thru Wednesday Night Suppers. Thank you to everyone that donated!

SBPC Hot Meals on Weekends – The current COVID-19 restrictions have made this service opportunity possibly more important than ever. These types of services have been declared "essential services" by the county, so we have been able to continue delivering meals. The 4th Saturday of each month we look for individuals to deliver meals to shut-ins. We have 2 routes with about 14 people on each route, so we usually need a total of 4 volunteers each month. Please contact Lu Taylor if you are interested in volunteering to deliver meals one month. The Saturday for this month will be June 27.

Join Us as We explore Neighborhood Church: Transforming Your Congregation into a Powerhouse for Mission by Krin Van Tatenhove and Rob Mueller


