Thank you for continuing to be an extraordinary church in these extraordinary times. In the short time left in which we have to be apart, let's continue to look for creative ways to connect, generous ways to give, and abundant reasons to rejoice.

The "Mission of the Month" for August is MAM (Memorial Area Ministries). MAM was started in 1981 as a coalition of 14 local churches and one synagogue to establish a network to provide emergency services to families living in poverty. Today, over 30 congregations provide financial and other support to MAM.

MAM provides a wide array of services to the community, which now includes (Spring Branch, Cypress and Alief). Services provided include: financial assistance programs, citizenship

classes, employment services, English instruction, immigration assistance, mental health counseling, after school and immunization programs, and special targeted programs like assistance for victims of the Watson Grinding explosion. MAM has seen a major increase in service requests in all their support services due to the COVID-19 pandemic.



Our church will be collecting funds for MAM to provide school uniforms for children during the month of August. Donations can be mailed to the Church Office, brought to the Drive-Thru WNS on August 19th, or given through the MAM SBPC Fundraiser Page (my.reason2race.com/SpringBranchPresbyterianChurch/MAMBacktoSchool2020). August Mission Updates & Opportunities

Hurricane Preparedness – As we enter the middle innings of hurricane season here on the Gulf Coast, we all need to be mindful and prepared for a hurricane and the problems they can cause. While most of us have the means and the ability to prepare ourselves with supplies, there are those in our community that are not as fortunate. The Mission Team will be preparing Hurricane Preparedness kits to go to those residents who receive Hot Meals on the Weekends by SBPC. These will be distributed during the month of August.

PCHAS Back-To-School Supplies – Our church is a big supporter of PCHAS (Presbyterian Children's Home and Services). During July, we had a Back to School Drive to provide school supplies for the children involved with PCHAS. During July, we collected over 300 items to donate to PCHAS for distribution. Thanks to everyone who contributed, and way to go SBPC!

SBPC Hot Meals on the Weekends – The current COVID-19 restrictions have made this service opportunity possibly more important than ever. These types of services have been declared "essential services" by the county, so we have been able to continue delivering meals. The 4th Saturday of each month we look for individuals to deliver meals to shut-ins. We have 2 routes with about 14 people on each route, so we usually need a total of 4 volunteers each month. Please contact Lu Taylor if you are interested in volunteering to deliver meals one month. The Saturday for this month will be August 22.

MAM Back to School Drive — During August, we will be collecting funds to donate to MAM to provide school uniforms. This will be a multi-congregational effort with other churches that support MAM.

- What's the purpose of the vessels in the pictures for each lesson?
- How do you reach out to members of the Circle who don't have a computer?
- How do you carry on Circle traditions such as light a Christ Candle?



Vacation Bible School Bread

Jane Trawick provided this recipe for the SBPC VBS in 1976. She and Cindy Sauer started a tradition kept "alive and well" by Ferrell and Wix Thorpe. The tradition has continued thanks to Ken and Linda Crawford, and now Doris Wright.



Although we are not together, we wanted to ensure that everyone has the recipe to partake in this tradition with you and your family at home. You are encouraged to send pictures of your bread making and baking to the Church.



Ingredients:

½ c. of warm water

1 package dry yeast

3 T. sugar

4½ c. flour

1 tsp. salt

1 ½ c. water (cold)

2 T. oil

Two round metal 1 pound coffee cans

Oil the inside of the coffee cans. Mix warm water, yeast and 1 T. of sugar. Let stand for 15 minutes. Mix dry ingredients, including 2 T. sugar in a large bowl. Add yeast mixture. Stir together, making a ball of dough. Spread about ½ c. flour onto a smooth, hard table. After all the ingredients are mixed together into a small ball of dough (in mixing bowl) put the dough on the flour on the table. Knead dough until smooth and elastic. Add flour to keep from sticking. Split the dough into two equal parts and put into oiled cans. Put lids on the cans and leave until the lid pops off (about 30 to 40 minutes). Bake at 350° for 30 minutes. Bread will be a beautiful golden brown.

Recipe Notes: If the coffee cans are really 11 or 13 oz., consider using 3 cans. If the dough rises too rapidly, "punch it down" into the can and let it rise again; you can do this twice and the bread should still bake OK. It's OK to put the can of dough in a refrigerator to slow the rising.




