The "Mission of the Month" for December is The Angel Tree Program and the Presbyterian Children's Home and Services (PCHAS) Ornament Tree.

The Angel Tree Program – Every year, our church receives the names of about 20 children who live in the zip codes around our church, providing gifts to the children of incarcerated parents. Although this ministry is virtual this year, we are still serving local children! This year, each child will

receive a \$40 Walmart gift card, which you will purchase directly through the SBPC Angel Website. We chose the \$40 gift card option since that amount is comparable to the two gifts that we would typically provide. We encourage SBPC folks to join together if that amount is out of your price range. There is more information on the next page about how to access, select, and purchase the gift cards for our Angel Tree children. This program is all virtual this year through the SBPC page of the Angel Tree website, so unfortunately, you *cannot* send a check to the Church Office. PCHAS Ornament Tree – PCHAS began in 1903 as an effort by the First Presbyterian Church of Dallas to house the orphaned children of a young mother who died of tuberculosis. Today, PCHAS serves over 5,000 children

across Texas, Louisiana and Missouri. The mission for PCHAS has broadened from strictly care for orphans, to include Maternity and Adoption services, Foster Care, Care for Families in Crisis, Medical Case Management, Youth Outreach, and Mental Health Services to name just a few. This year, the PCHAS Ornament Tree is in the Narthex, just outside of the Sanctuary. Each of the ornaments has a PCHAS tag attached with a suggested donation amount. You take the ornament home with you and leave the donation in the basket provided. We will donate the entire amount to PCHAS at the end of the month. December Mission Updates & Opportunities

Seafarer's Boxes Update and Thanks – The annual packaging and wrapping of Seafarer's Boxes was very different this year, but we still managed to exceed our yearly goal! Thank you to everyone that donated individual items, donated fully stocked boxes, wrapped filled boxes, made cards, and helped deliver. We were able to complete 107 boxes for the Seafarer's Center at the Port of Houston! Kevin, Donald, and Miguel delivered a total of 113 boxes, including 6 from our friends at John Knox Presbyterian Church.

Calling Seniors on Thanksgiving – Thank you to those who participated in calling local seniors on Thanksgiving to share the love of Christ with one another. We had 10 members from SBPC participate in this program through *Interfaith Ministries for Greater Houston!*

Mission Trip Update – Through our Presbytery and partners like Houston Responds, we have been identifying ways we can continue to help our neighbors in Louisiana who have been impacted by Hurricanes Laura and Delta. The Mission Team is partnering with Fuller Center for Disaster Recovery to plan a mission trip to go help our neighbors with rebuilding their homes. All skill levels are welcome, and we are hoping to send a team the weekend of January 15th-18th. If you are interested in attending, please let Pastor Kevin or Miguel know. The deadline to sign up is December 17th.

SBPC Hot Meals on Weekends – The current COVID-19 restrictions have made this service opportunity possibly more important than ever. The 4th Saturday of each month we look for individuals to deliver meals to shut-ins. We have 2 routes with about 14 people on each route, so we usually need a total of 4 volunteers each month. Please contact Lu Taylor if you are interested in volunteering to deliver meals one month. The Saturday for this month will be December 26th.

Dust off Your Halos – It's Time for Our Annual Angel Tree Christmas Program

SBPC has been participating in the Angel Tree Christmas Prison Ministry program for many years, providing Christmas gifts for the children of incarcerated parents. Every year, our church receives the names of about 20 children who live in the zip codes around our church.



Although this ministry is virtual this year, we are still be serving local *A Program of Prison Fellowship* children. Each child will be receiving a \$40 gift card to Walmart,

which you will purchase directly through the SBPC Angel Tree Website. *Unfortunately, you cannot send a check to the church. Everything will need to be done online through the SBPC Angel Tree page.* The children will receive these gift cards in the mail directly from Angel Tree.

Since Angel Tree is virtual this year, we are unable to provide the families with a basket of food like we usually do. Members that usually donate food to the baskets are encouraged to do one of the following:

- 1. Prior to checking out on the Angel Tree website, you can choose to include a \$40 Walmart gift card for the caregiver of the children. This generous gift could help them provide food for the family, or it could be a welcomed Christmas gift for them.
- 2. Instead of donating food for the Angel Tree baskets, bring the food that you would've donated to Worship on Sundays, or to the Drive-In Wednesday Night Suppers for the Fair Haven Food Panty.







Happy Hands Keeping Busy




Bible Study Using Zoom: January 19th at 7:00 p.m.
