My brothers and sisters in Christ,

These have been historically difficult times for many of us. With COVID-19, financial strains, and now the big winter storm, many of us have had our lives and our routines drastically upset. We have had our emotional, spiritual, and physical resources strained farther than we would have ever imagined.

As I was thinking about this, a random YouTube video popped up, which said it would explain how to upset steel. I had no idea how a piece of metal could get upset, so I was intrigued. What I found out is that "upsetting" is a term used by blacksmiths. While most of the time a smith is drawing out metal to thin and shape it, there are times when it is struck on the end in such a way that the opposite occurs. As a result of being "upset," metal gains strength, thickness, and mass.

I wonder if we can take a lesson from the blacksmiths of old. David was upset that his plans to build a temple were rejected by God. As a result, his son Solomon built a more magnificent one. Mary and Martha were upset that Jesus did not follow their requested schedule and their brother, Lazarus, died. As a result, we see one of the most powerful and inspirational miracles in all of scripture. When Paul and Silas were in prison in Philippi they sang and prayed and the prison gates miraculously opened. The guard was so upset that he almost killed himself. As a result, he asked about salvation and it was a pivotal point in the founding of the church. Later, the apostle Paul was upset that some of his church members were not setting a godly example because they could not get along. As a result, we see the book of Philippians which has inspired Christians for thousands of years. As we have seen in our sermons, the disciples were upset with Jesus when they found out that their routine of following him was about to be upset and Jesus was going to be crucified. But in the end, Christ accomplished our salvation.

Seeing a pattern here? We have all been upset with what life has thrown us. Could it be that God is working us like a piece of iron, making us stronger and more useful? Could it be that upsetting our normal, while not ever pleasant, is a sign of something amazing God is doing in us and through us? God certainly seems to work that way!

This season of Lent, my prayer is that each of us would have our "normal" upset, and that God would be glorified!

The "Mission of the Month" for March is BakerRipley.

BakerRipley provides outreach services to underserved communities in the Greater Houston area and surrounding communities. In addition to community centers where clients receive ESL classes, immigration services, GED assistance, etc., they also provide Disaster Recovery support services, community Head Start schools, job and career development services, senior support services, and tax and financial support

services.

Every day, BakerRipley is connecting hardworking families to opportunities to support their educational, financial, and civic aspirations. This belief extends from birth to older adults. BakerRipley Senior Services works directly with neighbors to create opportunities that honor their purpose and well-being. The Dementia Day Center provides a supportive environment where individuals with dementia can participate in purpose-filled, strength-based activities. Caregivers of older adults have the opportunity to access accurate information, education, and connect to others.



- Through BakerRipley's Workforce Solutions Initiatives Department, neighbors have had access to job coaching, training, and resources. 32% of customers that called the Workforce Solutions Department received a 20% higher paying job.
- 89% of neighbors who were employed obtained a 30% increase or higher in wages after participating in the program.
- ❖ In 2019, BakerRipley served 1,792 Adult Education Participants and 82% who tested made progress in learning English and other oral tests that were given.
- ❖ In 2019, BakerRipley helped complete 35,000 tax returns for our neighbors, which resulted in 55 million in tax refunds for low income families across the Houston Region.
- Through BakerRipley helping neighbors complete their tax returns, 3.8 million in legal fees were saved.

**Souper Bowl of Caring Update** – Thank you to everyone that participated in our Souper Bowl of Caring effort this year! We collected a total of 143lbs of food and \$307 in monetary donations. All donations were taken to the Fair Haven Food Pantry.

**SBPC Hot Meals on Weekends** – The current COVID-19 restrictions have made this service opportunity possibly more important than ever. The 4<sup>th</sup> Saturday of each month we look for individuals to deliver meals to shut-ins. We have 2 routes with about 14 people on each route, so we usually need a total of 4 volunteers each month. Please contact Lu Taylor if you are interested in volunteering to deliver meals one month. The Saturday for this month will be March 27<sup>th</sup>.
