Greetings, members and friends, and welcome to Holy Week!

It is hard to believe that we have been in pandemic mode for over a year. It was all of our hope that by this time, the extra measures of isolation would be a thing in our past. It has not happened that way. I am very thankful for the progress we have made, and hopeful that things are finally trending the right direction. Please join me in praying that we continue this trend.

One of the most difficult things about this time is not only the disease itself, but the isolation that we have all experienced. This is something new to our generation. Although we have taken historic steps to stay connected, none of us truly know what the result of the increased isolation is doing to our society. However, test results are beginning to also show unprecedented levels of anxiety and stress in children, adolescents, and adults alike. In each group, we are seeing new levels of stress-related mental distress and illness. Stress has a way of being released, whether we intend it or not, and can pop up in unexpected ways if we are not very careful. I also believe that we are created beings in whom there is a strong connection between body and soul. We know that mental stress can have huge negative impacts on our physical well-being. This means that the isolation necessary to protect us at this time could also be causing difficulties that may last long after the disease itself.

All of this points to something we knew, but are learning in new and powerful ways. First, we were created to be in community with one another. When we are not able to be part of intentional community, the effects may be much greater than we imagine. Put in a positive light, the value of community, something we may have taken for granted, is immense. Even the psalmist David taught us in Psalm 133, "Behold, how good and how pleasant it is for brethren to dwell together in unity!" In other words, community is healthy, necessary for our physical and spiritual well-being, and even curative.

So how do we balance our need for physical protection and community, when the two can sometimes seem at odds? Here are a couple of thoughts:

1. Please consider getting vaccinated. While I know that this is an immensely personal decision, your decision has huge ramifications, not only for yourself, but for community. While no vaccine is perfect, the CDC study of the very few people who have died after receiving a vaccine "revealed no evidence that vaccination contributed to patient deaths." Rather, when administered in a timely manner, have been 100% effective in preventing death from COVID, and that in the unlikely event that a vaccinated person is infected, the severity of the illness is greatly reduced. Studies are still being done to determine whether or not it is possible for a vaccinated person to spread COVID, but at the very least, it is highly unlikely. So, getting vaccinated is one very positive thing we can do for community. 2. Find ways to stay in community. Of course, virtual offerings are commonplace now. So do take advantage of those, even though they can never be a complete substitute for in-person contact. Remember, isolation increases stress. This does not mean, however, that community will be perfect. Even with all of its benefits, community is sometimes messy. We will not always agree on everything. Sometimes we may disagree sharply. This is the nature of all human relationships. What is perhaps unique at this time, is the increased need for patience, self-understanding, very clear communication, and the practice of forgiveness. When there is extra stress in the midst, community just takes more work. Yet the rewards are greater than ever.

This is Holy Week. We are celebrating the fact that Jesus laid down his life for us. Could there be a more important guiding image for us right now? Just as sacrifice was the way to new life and new hope for the early Christian community, it remains our only hope as well. But what a hope that is! There is a new beginning just over the horizon. Christ is risen! As one people, let us come together to the praise of Christ our King!

I hope to see you all for a great celebration on Easter morning.

He is risen indeed!

The "Mission of the Month" for April is Summerhouse. The mission of Summerhouse Houston is to support adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD), their families, and our community through employment, volunteerism, and partnerships to foster a culture of belonging, choice, and respect. We support our members to be fully and meaningfully included in the community through work, volunteer, and fun.

With the help of our wonderful supporters (Spring Branch Presbyterian included!), we made the following achievements in 2020:

- Provided inclusive day services and employment support to over 45 young adults.
- Adapted to the COVID-19 pandemic to provide virtual services during the stay-at-home order.
- Supported 100% of our members to volunteer in the community and/or have paid employment.
- Supported 100% of our members to make the decisions about what we do at Summerhouse.
- Surpassed our fundraising goal of \$80,000 during our Cirque du Summerhouse event – and then purchased a much-needed new van!
- Recycled over 24 tons of paper at our onsite enterprise, Shred for Independence.

SBPC Hot Meals on Weekends – The 4th Saturday of each month we look for individuals to deliver meals to shut-ins. Spring Branch Presbyterian Church COVID-19 Safety Protocols for Returning Groups

Regular activities will be allowed to resume using our facilities on April 1, 2021. The leader of each group must contact the Church Office prior to announcing any activities. This will allow us to make sure that the environment is safe and that safety protocols are still being followed. It will also allow us to make sure that we have no scheduling conflicts with either the Academy or our cleaning crew.

All returning activities will take place in the Gathering Place until further notice, with the exception of those events that occur on the weekends. As COVID-19 statistics and trends adapt, and as childcare facility guidelines and Academy protocols change, we will readdress the locations of onsite events.

These are provisional measures, based on the status of the pandemic today. We rejoice that the statistics are trending in the right direction, and that more people are being vaccinated. We have looked at the COVID-19 status, including the new variants being reported. We also have considered the vaccination status of our most at-risk members and our staff.

Whenever possible, we urge group leaders to consider Zoom/digital options until the pandemic restraints have been lifted, and our membership feels comfortable returning in-person.

Before Leaving Home

Prior to coming to Worship, Sunday School, or any other church activities, please ask yourself these questions. If any of your answers to the questions are "yes", please stay home.

- Have you or any person with whom you live, experienced any of the following symptoms of COVID-19 or any of these situations in the preceding 72 hours?
 - Fever of 100.4°F or higher, new or worsening cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, chills, repeated shaking with chills, muscle pain, headache, sore throat, new loss of taste or smell, vomiting or diarrhea
 - In the last 14 days, have you been in direct contact with someone currently positive for COVID-19?
 - Have you, or someone with whom you live recently been tested and received the results? Were any of the results positive?
 - Are you, or someone with whom you live with awaiting COVID-19 test results?

By attending in-person activities and events, you are agreeing that you will follow these guidelines to protect the safety and wellbeing of all our brothers and sisters in Christ at Spring Branch Presbyterian Church.

- Social distancing measures will be in effect.
- All participants (ages 5 and up) will be required to wear masks. While we were hopeful that by this time we could lift the mask requirements, and are still hopeful that this will happen soon, we are continuing to follow CDC guidelines.
- Hand sanitizer will be available in the foyer.

- We will not shake hands, hug, or otherwise touch.
- No refreshments will be served, and water fountains will remain unavailable. You are encouraged to bring a water bottle if you feel that you might want water.

Arrival & Departure

- Unless you have a pre-scheduled appointment, please do not enter the Education Building.
- You may enter/exit the front doors of the Gathering Place via the sidewalk from the parking lot gate, or the side door along the ditch.
- Upon entering the Gathering Place, you will sign an attendance sheet in the foyer. This information will be used for the purposes of contact tracing should that need arise.
- Should you need a restroom, the Gathering Place bathrooms will be available.
- You are encouraged to sanitize the chairs and tables used, as well as frequently used surfaces. There is a basket of spray bottles with cleaning solutions in the warming kitchen.

Some of those projects include:

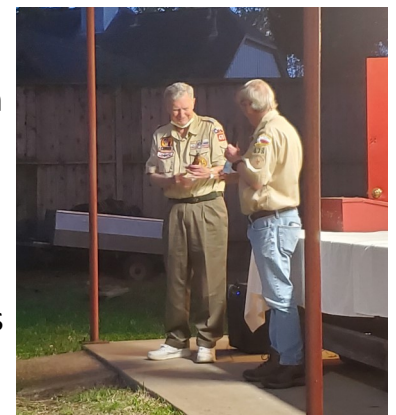
- Roof repair or replacement
- Painting the Scout Hut
- Expanding the front overhang 12ft
- Creating a 12ft overhang in the rear of the Scout Hut
- Removing the water tank in the lot behind the Scout Hut
- Extending the north side of the Scout Hut for a future camping trailer
- Acquiring a camping trailer
- Removing the fence behind the Scout Hut
- Installing pavers from the Scout Hut to the parking lot

In September of 2020, the Session voted to close the Designated Scout Fund, and give those funds to Boy Scout Troop 478 to put towards the upcoming updates and repairs to the Scout Hut.



This last Monday, March 29th, Troop 478 held a Court of Honor. Pastor Kevin and Garth Heitshusen were in attendance for the event to present the surprise donation of \$2,090.04 to the Troop.

Following that surprise donation, another surprise happened. Garth Heitshusen was presented with a knife that was hand crafted by Kevin Boyd on behalf of Spring Branch Presbyterian Church for his many years of continued service to Troop 478. The materials used to make the knife were comprised of items from the Scout Hut, a piece of walnut from the Heitshusen's farm was used to make the handle, colors representing the Boy Scouts & Cub Scouts were used, as well as a cross to represent the Church.

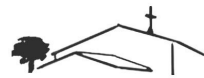

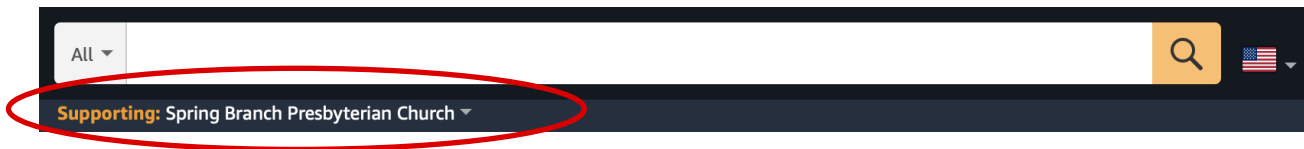
