Greetings, brothers and sisters in Christ!

It has been more than a year now that we have been under Covid restrictions. As of the time of this writing, while there are (unfortunately) parts of the world where we are still seeing growing trends in Covid-related deaths, we are seeing positive trends within our country, state, and city. At the same time, more and more people have been vaccinated. It does seem, from our informal surveys, that most of our congregation has chosen to be vaccinated at this point. Locally, most school districts have announced that masks will not be required following the end of this academic year, though the details vary between districts.

So, where does this leave us? We are welcoming groups back into the church facilities, as we work to ensure a safe schedule. The Academy is once again full of children and we are working on a safe but full schedule for the summer. In worship, we have moved the available seating closer together in accordance with new current guidelines and pew Bibles have been replaced, to be followed soon by the new hymnals. At our last session meeting, we looked at current trends and we hope to follow the lead of the school districts concerning masks, but will be watching the statistics as our next stated meeting approaches. Slowly, folks are returning to worship in person and this is a good thing.

As I said, we have been at this a long time. Many of us are growing weary. However, when describing times of great difficulty to come Jesus said, "Lift up your heads. Redemption draws near!" That means things are almost over. And I believe that is where we find ourselves right now. In other words, don't swim most of the way across the ocean only to give up within sight of the shore.

I am praying for our church body as we come to an end of this difficult time. I pray for patience, acceptance, and love one for another that transcends our own comfort levels, avoids judging others for the choices they make, and glorifies God by worshiping the Lord with our whole heart, the best we can, wherever we are.




