The "Mission of the Month" for July is the Mission of Yahweh. The Mission of Yahweh is a faith-based shelter that has been empowering, enriching and restoring the lives of homeless women and children and provides outreach services to low-income communities since 1961. The Mission of Yahweh offers many life-changing programs focused on ending the cycle of homelessness and dependency, such as transition and aftercare programs, educational and vocational support, case management and spiritual counseling. Each year, over 200

volunteers per month help keep the campus in good working order by completing necessary projects and providing support for programs, chapel services, and children's activities.

Mission Facts

- The Mission is one of only a few shelters for homeless women and children in Houston.
- The Mission has grown to a 12-building campus in Northwest Houston.
- The Mission averages over 120 residents per day in a normal year. On average, 40% of The Mission's residents are children under the age of 13.
- The Mission operates with a lean staff and many volunteers.
- The Mission serves a growing need in our community. Year after year, The Mission is forced to turn away over 4,000 women and children due to lack of beds.
- The average resident family has 2.5 children per mother.
- The majority of The Mission's operating funds are in-kind donations that come from individuals, churches and businesses.
- The Mission does not receive government funding.
- Through a collaboration with other local resources, classes and services are provided for a variety of subjects including: job readiness, computer training, money management, education, health, parenting, and more.
- On average, it costs the Mission \$40.00 per day to house, feed, and clothe one homeless woman or child
- The average stay for a Mission resident is 4 to 6 months.
- In any given year, 40 to 60% of our resident women are working or are enrolled in school.

SBPC Hot Meals on Weekends – The current COVID-19 restrictions have made this service opportunity possibly more important than ever. These types of services have been declared "essential services" by the county, so we have been able to continue delivering meals. The 4th Saturday of each month we look for individuals to deliver meals to shut-ins. We have 2 routes with about 14 people on each route, so we usually need a total of 4 volunteers each month. Please contact Lu Taylor if you are interested in volunteering to deliver meals one month. The Saturday for this month will be July 24th.

Four years ago, we started the ministry/care program called "The Gathering Place," for persons with memory challenges and their caregivers. This is a once-a-month program from 10 AM-1 PM. The "guests" and their caregivers come for fun, food, fellowship & exercise. Our church volunteers are necessary to help with the program. If you were to come observe the program, I think you would see that everyone seemed to be having a lot of fun, including the volunteers! We have a different theme for each month and like to decorate for the theme. We also try to tie the crafts and the lunch into the theme. Some dress for the theme, if possible. If you talk to some of our volunteers, I think most will say they get as much out of it as the guests do. AND, you get a home-cooked, nutritional lunch!

We need lots of volunteers! We already have quite a few of the main positions filled, but we still have room for YOU! You might be helping with crafts or exercise, or helping with the music. Or, perhaps helping prepare and serve lunch. OR, you can just come and visit with the Care Partners. REMEMBER: it is only once a month!!


