How does life in our community of faith respond to a bunch of exhausted people?

I certainly do not have all of the answers, but one thing I do know. We need each other more now more than ever. There is something amazing about having one another. We do not need to be Lone Rangers. We can indeed be strong for one another.

I am reminded of Paul's words:

"For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord." -Romans 8:38-39

I hope you are still joining me in praying for an end to this pandemic, and for all of us who have been affected in so many ways. But until that time, I pray that we do not miss this opportunity to learn just how close our God is, and yet, how powerful. Christ has promised to be with us even during those times when it is not safe to go back in the water. Might this also be a model for us, in community, right now?

Please pray for your church staff and session as we navigate these turbulent waters and seek Christ's guidance. And thank you so much to all of you who are doing just that!

The "Mission of the Month" for September is CarePartners. CarePartners is a nonprofit, volunteer led organization that provides support, education, and resources for caregivers and

quality care for those living with memory loss and other challenges of aging. Much of the care is for the vulnerable elderly and individuals with Alzheimer's or related dementia. CarePartners serves all

people at no cost. They provide life-changing care as well as educational and support services to more than 5,700 people in the Greater Houston area. Their award-winning volunteer Care Team® model includes more than 2,500 individuals who help support four primary programs:



Gathering Place – A 3.5 hour highly engaging program specifically for individuals living with early to moderate Alzheimer's, related Dementia, or memory loss. Planned activities strengthen motor and social skills through games, music, crafts, lunch, and socialization. Family caregivers receive 3.5 hours of respite, a break and time away from caregiving responsibilities, while their loved one attends each Gathering Place.

Second Family – A homebound program focused on helping individuals living with illness or other challenges due to aging. An extended family of trained volunteers offer support and companionship for homebound individuals who belong to a partnering congregation. Family caregivers receive respite, a break and time away from their caregiving responsibilities.

Common Ground – A support group established for family caregivers that offers emotional support, encouragement, friendship, and helpful tips about self-care and caregiving. Family caregivers caring for loved ones with Alzheimer's, related Dementias, memory loss, or other challenges due to aging may join this monthly support group.

Caregiver Conferences – Educational events that connect family caregivers with education and community resources on how to provide quality care to their loved one.

September Mission Updates & Opportunities



MAM Back to School Supplies – During the month of August, SBPC was collecting funds for MAM's Back to School Uniform Voucher Drive. MAM coordinates with school guidance counselors and local vendors to provide school uniforms for local needy families. MAM's 2021 goal is to provide \$50 uniform vouchers to 5,000 children. There's still an opportunity to contribute if you haven't had a chance to do so! Donations can be placed in the offering plate on Sunday mornings or mailed to the Church Office. Please make checks payable to SBPC, and write *MAM Back to School* in the memo line. We will have an update in the next PresPress regarding this campaign.

SBPC Hot Meals on Weekends – The current COVID-19 restrictions have made this service opportunity possibly more important than ever. These types of services have been declared "essential services" by the county, so we have been able to continue delivering meals. The 4th Saturday of each month we look for individuals to deliver meals to shut-ins. We have 2 routes with about 14 people on each route, so we usually need a total of 4 volunteers each month. Please contact Lu Taylor if you are interested in volunteering to deliver meals one month. The Saturday for this month will be September 25th.

The Academy closes at 6:00 PM, so please do not block the front doors of the education building, and watch for crossing pedestrians. If we are experiencing rain, the drive-thru lane will be used by the academy parents for pickup. Please monitor the rain forecast, and if needed, park in a space until after the parent pickup has concluded.

The dinners will be free, but we are accepting donations. We are also accepting donations for the Fair Haven Food Pantry (non-perishable food items, plastic grocery bags, cleaning supplies, and paper products). We are also continuing to accept thank you cards for our dedicated Houston healthcare workers. Please do not seal the envelopes.



The National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) provides affordable insurance to property owners, renters, and businesses to help mitigate the effects of flooding on homes, businesses, and properties.

For those applying for the NFIP, most policies take 30 days to take effect. And for those who already have a policy, please note that it does not renew automatically. It is important to start the process soon.

- Toilet paper, paper towels, and garbage bags
- Dental care and vision products
- Change of clothes, pair of shoes and blanket per person

- Diapers

COMMUNICATION

- Portable, battery-powered radio
- Extra batteries for flashlights, lanterns, and radio
- Extra cell phone battery or car charger

PET NEEDS

- 7-day supply of non-perishable pet food
- Cage or pet carrier and leash
- Pet medications and pet first aid kit
