Dear Friends and Members of Spring Branch Presbyterian Church,

Happy new year and welcome to the holiday season. That's right. The Christian new year starts with the first Sunday in Advent. This is the season when we prepare ourselves for the coming of the Lord. And it is the season when Santa Claus gets both a lot of glory and a lot of grief.

Some have been curious as to the origin of Santa. So I thought this would be a good time to explore it. Now the American Santa Claus is an odd character, dressed in red with a white, silly hat. He gives out toys and rides around in a sleigh with flying reindeer and goes down chimneys on Christmas Eve to deliver gifts to the good and lumps of coal and switches to bad boys and girls. A lot of people think that Santa Claus is just a made up myth to coerce children into behaving properly. And while I'm not so in favor of the modern version, this tradition does have its roots in a very real, very meaningful story.

Many of us know that the "other" name for Santa Claus is Saint Nicholas. The real Saint Nicholas was a Christian bishop in modern day Turkey, who lived from around AD 270 to December 6th, 343. In some parts of Christendom, December 6th is still commemorated as his feast day. Nicholas is most remembered for performing many miracles.

One of the most famous stories of his life and charitable work involves three daughters whose father had no dowry and were facing the strong possibility of having to live on the streets. Under the cover of darkness, Nicholas threw three bags of gold coins into the window of the family's house in order to save both the daughters and the father from the shame of having to accept charity. Other stories involve him finding grain to feed the people in the time of famine, freeing righteous people from the executioner, and even defending Christian doctrine in the face of heresy.

So how did we get from Saint Nick to the modern Santa Claus? I think the stories have evolved through the centuries. For instance, another story of Nicholas tells of him throwing bags of coins down the chimney, much like the modern story of Santa going down chimneys on Christmas Eve. It is also interesting that the hat he is often depicted of wearing looks very much like a "miter" which is a hat worn by a bishop. Likewise, the bishops of that era wore the imperial color of red. Even the name of "Santa Claus" is the early American colonial attempt that subsequently stuck at pronouncing the name Sinterklaas, which is the Dutch word for Saint Nicholas.

I really like what one author writes:

"Thus, when your children begin to think they are too old for Santa Claus, or Sinterklaas, or Saint Nicholas, and that he is not real, you do not have to lie to them, because Saint Nicholas is very real and is still praying for us, that we might likewise show generosity to those who need our help and to do so not for our own glory but the greater glory of God in thanksgiving for the coming of the incarnation, the Christ child we will all soon celebrate who brings with him our redemption." This Advent, I know of no better model for preparing our hearts than that of Saint Nicholas. A jolly tradition indeed! May the peace of Christ and goodwill towards all be with you.

The "Mission of the Month" for December is The Angel Tree Program and the Presbyterian Children's Home and Services (PCHAS) Ornament Tree.

The Angel Tree Program – Every year, our church receives the names of about 20 children who live in the zip codes around our church. Through contact with each of the families, we determine items that the children need or want. In addition to two gifts designated from the parent, each

child receives a gift from SBPC. Each family also receives a generous food basket. We will be collecting kid-friendly, nonperishable foods for these baskets, so watch for collection bins outside the church office. Tags will be available beginning on Sunday, December 5, before and after worship, and also on Wednesday, December 8, at dinner. Be sure to pick up one or two! Here's what you do: select an angel tag (or two). Purchase the gift (*in the \$20 price range*). Wrap the gift, sticking the tag to the front of the package. Return the gift to the church office no later than Wednesday, December 15.



PCHAS Ornament Tree – PCHAS began in 1903 as an effort by the First Presbyterian Church of Dallas to house the orphaned children of a young mother who died of tuberculosis. Today, PCHAS serves over 5,000 children

across Texas, Louisiana and Missouri. The mission for PCHAS has broadened from strictly care for orphans, to include Maternity and Adoption services, Foster Care, Care for Families in Crisis, Medical Case Management, Youth Outreach, and Mental Health Services to name just a few. This year, the PCHAS Ornament Tree is in the Narthex, just outside of the Sanctuary. Each of the ornaments has a PCHAS tag attached with a suggested donation amount. You take the ornament home with you and leave the donation in the basket provided. We will donate the entire amount to PCHAS at the end of the month. 
