

Dear friends and members of Spring Branch,

The famous Irish playwright, critic, and political activist, George Bernard Shaw, was known for his controversial viewpoints. For instance, he loudly opposed such things as vaccination and organized religion. His work spanned two world wars. In his last writing in 1950, at the age of 94, he looks back over his accomplishments and writes: "The science to which I pinned my faith is bankrupt. Its counsels, which should have established the millennium, led, instead, directly to the suicide of Europe. I believed them once. In their name, I helped to destroy the faith of millions of worshipers in the temples of a thousand creeds. And now they look at me and witness the great tragedy of an atheist who has lost his faith." While I do not agree with much of what Shaw said, I am grateful for his honesty. He lived through easily the most tumultuous time of the 20th century. At the end, he realized that his life's emphasis had been totally wrong.

So we, too, are living in a very stressful time in which we remain isolated from one another. Our world is changing in ways no one could have predicted. Many of us fear the future. Some have turned their back on their faith. I keep hearing heart rending stories of churches closing their doors because people have stopped coming and do not plan to return. Could it be that we, in this new society, are making the same life mistakes as those made by Shaw? Could it be that we are placing our trust in human wisdom, rather than trusting in God? Could it be that our isolation has caused us to think more of self than of others, or of our Lord? Could it be that God is showing us how misguided faith in science or our political system is bound to fail in the end? And could it also be that Christ's invitation to follow is actually clearer and more relevant than at any time in recent history?

In last month's sermon series, we focused on how our faith in Christ helps us to live above fear. I truly do not have all of the answers. But together, with the help of God's Word and the Holy Spirit, I do believe we can emerge from this time stronger and wiser.

Many thanks to all of you who have remained so faithful to our ministry and vision at Spring Branch Presbyterian Church. To say that you are appreciated is a gross understatement. Thank you for being part of a wonderful family of faith and for the many ways you are a servant to our Lord during these unusual times.




