Dear friends and members of SBPC,

I have spoken both publicly and privately to many of you about the alarming level of stress I see in our population today. The possible causes seem to be abundant. We are still dealing with Covid, and we do not know what the future might bring. Inflation is at the highest level in over 40 years. Many are now having a hard time driving and/or buying food. We are a nation divided. The political wars are bitter and nasty. We are grieving over gun violence and trying to figure out what, if anything, we can do to fix the problem. The war in Ukraine continues to rage on with innocent people being slaughtered. Nearly every day now, I see people driving like maniacs on our highways, and road rage has become all too common. This is, of course, just a partial list. But what could we possibly have to be stressed about? We are suffering in the present and afraid of the future.

More importantly, is there any help offered in our faith? I believe the answer is a resounding yes! I do believe the answer lies in remembering who God is! Too seldom do I even hear of God being mentioned when we throw out desperate plans to solve these problems. But as followers of Christ, we know that our only true hope is in God.

Recently I was doing some reading in our Brief Confession of Faith. I noticed that four times we are reminded that we trust God. That is pretty amazing for such a short document. Have we, the church, forgotten this? In fact, the confession ends by using words from Romans 8.

"With believers in every time and place, we rejoice that nothing in life or in death can separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord."

Whatever this world throws at us, we must remember that God is, and always has been, with us. And that will never change. God is indeed watching us, and not from a distance. In Psalm 32:8 we are told, "I will instruct you and teach you the way you should go; I will counsel you with my eye upon you." God's eye is an incredible thought. I see all of the medical, political, and economic forecasts out there, and none of them will likely be correct. But nothing that happens will ever be a surprise to God. Theologians like to use big words starting with "omni" when trying to describe the attributes of our transcendent God. To name a few, God is omnipresent (everywhere at once), omnitemporal (transcending time), omnisapient (all knowing). What an amazing God we serve! And the eye of this God is promised to be instructing us and leading us, even through (or perhaps especially through) these turbulent days.

As your pastor, I want you to know that God is with us. Perhaps that sounds so trite because we use the phrase so often. But when we consider WHO God truly is, I find it to be a great comfort. I hope you do too. So no, your pastor does not have all of the answers to all of our problems. All I can hope to do is to point you to the ONE who is already there in the future, who is working through our world and our church, even when we see it the least, and who is reaching out with everlasting comforting arms to us this moment.

My sisters and brothers, may you find rest and find it abundantly. In Christ's Service,

The "Mission of the Month" for July is the Mission of Yahweh. The Mission of Yahweh is a faith-based shelter that has been empowering, enriching and restoring the lives of homeless women and children and has provided outreach services to low-income communities since 1961. The Mission of Yahweh offers many life-changing programs focused on ending the cycle of homelessness and dependency, such as transition and aftercare programs, educational and vocational support, case management and spiritual counseling. Each year, over 200

volunteers per month help keep the campus in good working order by completing necessary projects and providing support for programs, chapel services, and children's activities.

#### Mission Facts

- The Mission is one of only a few shelters for homeless women and children in Houston.
- The Mission has grown to a 12-building campus in Northwest Houston.
- The Mission averages over 120 residents per day in a normal year. On average, 40% of The Mission's residents are children under the age of 13.
- The Mission operates with a lean staff and many volunteers.
- The Mission serves a growing need in our community. Year after year, The Mission is forced to turn away over 4,000 women and children due to lack of beds.
- The average resident family has 2.5 children per mother.
- The majority of The Mission's operating funds are in-kind donations that come from individuals, churches and businesses.
- The Mission does not receive government funding.
- Through a collaboration with other local resources, classes and services are provided for a variety
  of subjects including: job readiness, computer training, money management, education, health,
  parenting, and more.
- On average, it costs the Mission \$40.00 per day to house, feed, and clothe one homeless woman
  or child
- The average stay for a Mission resident is 4 to 6 months.
- In any given year, 40 to 60% of our resident women are working or are enrolled in school.

These are the type of hats that Betty made to send to kids in Kenya.


Betty has about 7 looms that she will share for the workshop, or you can purchase them at craft stores or on Amazon. They also have sets that come with several size looms for
