In the movie Forrest Gump, Jenny and Forrest walk to the place of her upbringing and her terrible story of abuse. She begins to throw rocks until she runs out. She then throws her sandals at her old house before collapsing. Forrest comments, "Sometimes, I guess there just aren't enough rocks."

In the wake of the recent tragedy in Uvalde, I know a number of us are feeling like we had rocks to throw. Like Jenny, we might feel slightly and temporarily better by throwing rocks. However, it did not actually address her problem. All she managed to do was to break a few old windows on an abandoned building. And many are indeed finding rocks to throw. It is a natural response to our anger, our hurt, our outrage. My question to all of us is whether we are throwing at a target that is helpful. The problem with rocks is that they hurt when they hit.

In Ephesians 4:26 we read, *"Be angry, and yet do not sin; do not let the sun go down on your anger."* Being angry is not, in and of itself, wrong. In fact I am very angry right now. Here is a partial list:

- I am angry that this violence happens in our country.
- I am angry that even more parents will experience the anguish of losing a child.
- I am angry that the police did not stop this incident much faster.
- I am angry at the attempts on "both sides" to use this event for their own political purposes.
- I am angry that there was effectively no way to stop this person, who had many known red flags, from purchasing a firearm, especially the ones he bought.
- I am angry that there was essentially no mental help for this individual.
- I am angry that the school did not follow their own safety protocols, despite having just gone through training.
- I am angry that there were federal dollars available to make this school safe, but it was never done.
- I am angry about being told how clergy should think, how we should protest, and even what to wear when we do.
- I am angry at the name calling, the disrespect, and the hateful speech coming from the mouths of those who claim to be the more loving people.

And there is so much more. I could go on for quite a while, and I imagine that many of us could as well. But sometimes, I guess, there just aren't enough rocks.

So what can we do? Everyone seems to be asking this right now, so I thought I would give you some suggestions, knowing that you have other good ones as well.

1. Pray Fervently

Contrary to what I have been hearing out there, prayer is not doing nothing! I know from my own recent experiences that it is a very tangible source of strength.

2. Listen Genuinely

I am actually hearing a lot of agreement from both sides on this. Please get past the areas where we disagree and truly listen to the "other side." We are all in this together. We must stop vilifying people we do not understand, or with whom we have honest disagreements.

3. Give Wisely

While I wish we could simply write a check and fix the problem with gun violence, that isn't going to happen. Yet there are starting to emerge some funds which will directly help the lives of the victimized families, such as memorial funds. There are other ways to give; towards a new mental health hospital which will be built as soon as possible. Consider giving towards projects designed to making your particular world safer with structure and personnel upgrades. These are only three examples, but watch for wise ways to give which will indeed have an impact.

4. Love Courageously

If you have a passion for your point of view, then be angry without sinning. Put your words and actions into a context where you will be heard. If you are seen only as angry, there are very few who will want to listen. Do not make one particular viewpoint the only basis for fellowship. Understanding and a better world will be the result. Then, if we are one, the world will know of the love of Christ.

5. Throw the right rocks

These days, we need to make sure that our anger at a particular person, group, or ideal is justified. Anger is energy and we only have a finite supply. Further, with the added stress from the pandemic lately, we are seeing crime greatly increase. We are seeing anger acted out in inappropriate ways. It is not excusable, but it is understandable. We need to make sure that our anger does not come out against those we love at an unexpected time. If we need to vent, to scream, to pound the dust, there can certainly be value in that. Find a way to care for yourself. But please make sure you are not leaving a wide wake of collateral damage.

Brothers and sisters, I want you to know that I am here with you and that together we will get through this.

The Mission of the Month for June is the **East Spring Branch Food Pantry!** The Food Pantry is located at Holy Cross Lutheran Church, nestled at the corner of Westview and Wirt Rd. Their mission is to provide food, free of cost, to families in urgent need, who reside in zip codes 77024, 77040, 77041, 77043, 77055, 77080, 77091, or 77092. The organization is completely

volunteer based – there are no employees. Therefore, they rely on its volunteers and donations – both cash and food.

Previously, the pantry used one-half of its current building and shared it with the maintenance equipment of the church. The pantry has since taken over the whole building and added an

additional 20 feet of space beyond that. The choice-style pantry now looks like a small grocery store, where our friends can come, and with guidance, choose the food their families would like to eat. With the new construction, there is now a Donation Center where donations can be dropped off.

Food Donations for the East Spring Branch Food Pantry will be collected throughout the entire month of June. Donations may be brought to Worship on Sundays, the Covered Dish Supper on June 11th, or the Idea Spring Game Night on June 25th.

There will be no Board Meetings, Bible Moderator Meetings, Bible Study, or ZIP Trips during the Summer.





FLOOD INSURANCE

The National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) provides affordable insurance to property owners, renters, and businesses to help mitigate the effects of flooding on homes, businesses, and properties.

For those applying for the NFIP, most policies take 30 days to take effect. And for those who already have a policy, please note that it does not renew automatically. It is important to start the process soon.

- Hand sanitizer or disinfectant wipes
- Toilet paper, paper towels, and garbage bags
- Dental care and vision products
- Change of clothes, pair of shoes and blanket per person

BABY ITEMS

- Baby formula and bottles
- Diapers

COMMUNICATION

- Portable, battery-powered radio
- Extra batteries for flashlights, lanterns, and radio
- Extra cell phone battery or car charger

PET NEEDS

- 7-day supply of non-perishable pet food
- Cage or pet carrier and leash
- Pet medications and pet first aid kit
