From the desk of Pastor Mark...

My dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

Many years ago, I knew a wonderful man named Bob. He was an elder and an extremely active member of the last church I served. I admired many things about Bob: he was an old-fashioned gentleman, he had a great sense of humor, he adored his wife and family, he was always ready to serve the church in any way he could – and he was one of the smartest people I ever knew.

During Bob's career, he had been a chemist for a major chemical company. He studied at major universities around the country, and he held several degrees in science. When he and his wife moved to a retirement center, he joined the monthly science presentations and discussions that occurred there – and even led a few. It was one way the residents of that retirement center got to know him and his wife quickly.

Because Bob was a really smart guy, you might think he could make other people feel pretty dumb when he talked. But exactly the opposite was true! If you asked him a scientific question, he would answer in such a way that you felt uplifted and informed - not dumb at all for asking. Not every brilliant person can do that, but Bob was good at it.

My favorite thing about Bob was his outlook on the miracle of life as given by God the Father. When some of Bob's scientific colleagues would challenge him on matters of faith, Bob would debate them all day, and then some to try to convince them to see life another way. When he was once asked, "Bob, when you look through a microscope and see a cell with all its structure, how can you believe that an all-powerful being created that?" Bob's answer was a cheerful exclamation: "How can you not believe when you see that?" Hard to argue with that...

About ten years ago, Bob finally lost a long fight he had with cancer. He had been taking a medication for years that kept it in check, but that medicine finally stopped working. At the time, his type of cancer only responded to that particular medicine; so when it quit working, Bob knew it would only be a matter of time. Turned out, he only had about a month to live.

When he finally died, it was a peaceful ending. His family grieved for their loss, but they also rejoiced in knowing their husband, father, and grandfather was with the Lord he believed in so strongly. He was my friend, and I miss him still.

Thanks, Bob, for always seeing the Lord - and for leading others to Him. Amen!

Missions of the Month



The Mission of Yahweh

The Mission Team wants you to know about some of the benevolences our church supports. The "Mission of the Month" for July is The Mission of

Yahweh, which is a faith-based, non-denominational emergency & transitional shelter that provides homeless women and children with food, clothing, shelter, and services.

The Mission is one of only a few shelters for homeless women and their children, and has served Northwest Houston since 1961. The Mission has approximately 120 residents per day, with at least 50 of those being children. Additionally, 40% to 60% of the women are enrolled in school. On average, it costs the Mission \$40.00 per day to house, feed, and clothe homeless women and children. The Mission of Yahweh is excited to share with our congregation that they will be building a new dormitory to house additional women in need in our community. This will help alleviate the number of women and children they must turn away due to not having space.

Furthermore, our congregation supports the Mission throughout the year by conducting donation drives and giving a yearly benevolence. We also have many members and friends that donate items to the resale store. The store was recently renovated, and a grand re-opening was held on June 29th. All proceeds from the store go back to support the programs throughout the year.

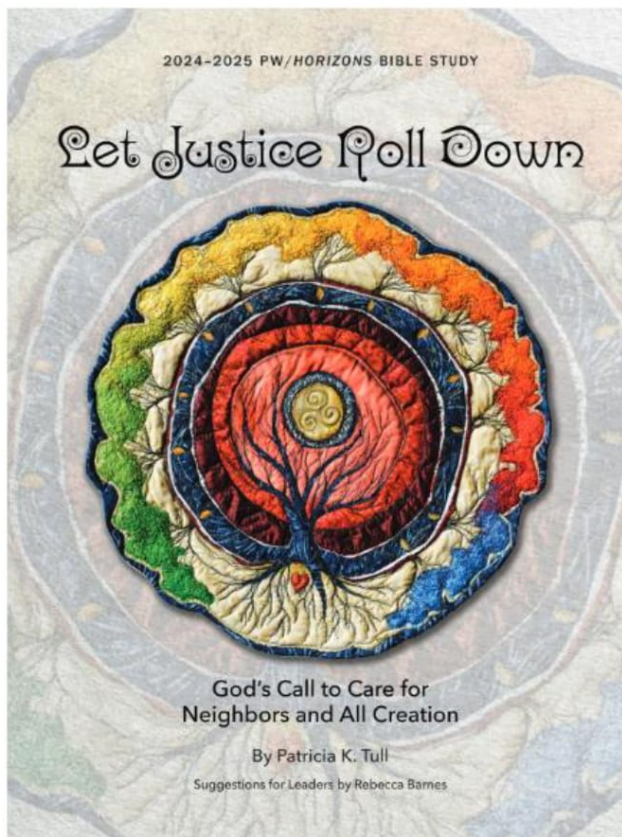

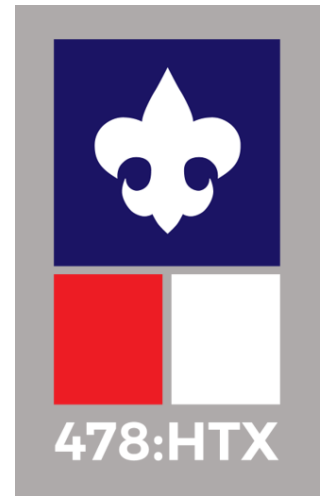

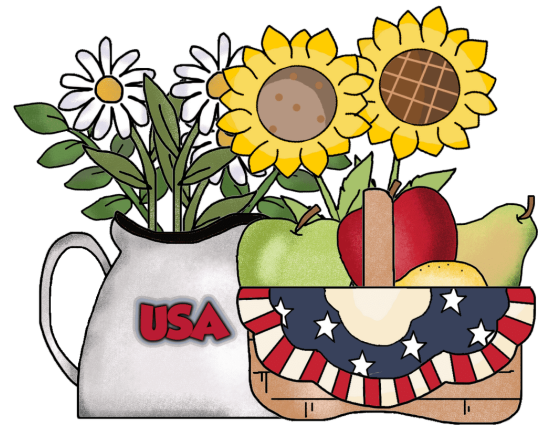

HURRICANE PREPAREDNESS



The International District would like to remind everyone that Hurricane Season is upon us. We all need to be smart and plan ahead for all kinds of disasters: natural, man-made, technological and terrorist related. In Southeast Texas, however, the most likely disaster scenario is a Hurricane.

BEFORE THE HURRICANE

- Monitor local TV or AM 740 KTRH
- Check supplies; especially water
- Fuel Vehicles & Generators
- Cover Windows with Plywood
- Bring in all objects that could become missiles
- Take pictures of property & contents for insurance purposes

DON'T FORGET THE PETS!

Pet disaster kits should include: medications, first aid kits, sturdy leashes and collars, carriers to transport pets safely, current photos with owner or family members, food, potable water, litter/pan, muzzle, can opener, and toys.

5 GALLONS OF WATER, PER PERSON, PER DAY.

STOCK EMERGENCY SUPPLIES

>> *at least 72 hours worth* <<

- First Aid Kit
- NOAA Radio & Batteries
- Flashlight & Batteries
- Extra Eye Glasses
- Bottled Water & Non-perishable Food
- Clothing & Bedding
- Toilet Paper & Personal Hygiene Items
- Medications & Prescription copies
- Cash & Credit Cards
- Photo ID & Important Documents
- Baby & Elderly Necessities

Make a check list of necessary pre-hurricane preparations and review with your family. Review it again when there is a storm in the Gulf. Discuss evacuation plans with your family.

Check Radio 740 and local television media for updates on zones being evacuated.

Make sure your home insurance policy is current and remember that standard policies may not cover flood/ wind damage.
