From the desk of Pastor Mark...

My dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

I officially began attending school in 1960 when I attended nursery school at age 3. From that year, I was continually in school as a student or as a teacher until the fall of 2011. That's a span of 51 straight years of school. (That's enough for anyone!)

In the fall of 2011, when I suddenly realized I was not preparing for any type of school experience, I marveled at how long I had been "in school" without a single break. It impressed me and made me a little sad at the same time. I remembered all the good times and all the great people I met along the way – both my teachers and my students. I chose not to remember or even think about the bad.

But when the beginning of school rolled around the following year, 2012, I was determined to do something besides just sitting and watching it happen. The church I was serving, Heritage PC in Cypress, was near several elementary schools. I talked it over with the Session elders, and we decided to adopt one nearby elementary school. We met with the local principal and discussed how our little church could help. In the end, we decided to take care of the teachers. We catered a few in-service days by bringing breakfast or lunch. We raised money and gave large gift cards to teachers who were having a hard time making ends meet; once or twice, we gave gift cards to Home Depot or Lowes when Hurricane Harvey damaged a few of the teachers' homes. We served on various school committees. We left little gifts in the teacher mailboxes just prior to Christmas vacation and the start of state testing. We loved and encouraged those teachers, and we made some good friends too.

Looking back on those years of working with Postma Elementary School in Cy-Fair ISD, I feel proud that our little church figured out a way to support a school in our own neighborhood - without trying to do more than we were capable of doing.

It may not have been the same as attending school or college or graduate school or seminary or being a teacher myself - but it was a great way to remind myself how important school was and to share that feeling with others.

It was a call from the Lord I never even considered. (Some of them are like that, aren't they?)

It was something I would love to do again. Amen!

Missions of the Month

This mission provides support, education, resources, and respite to family caregivers, and quality care to those individuals living with memory loss, Alzheimer's or Dementia and other challenges of aging. CarePartners bridges the gap between healthcare and social

The Gathering Place is a free opportunity for family caregivers to receive respite, while their loved ones participate in fun and lively activities. Seven former students named for the College of Architecture Harold L. Adams '61, Outstanding Alumni Award



The Texas A&M College of Architecture has announced seven distinguished former students for the College of Architecture Harold L. Adams '61, Outstanding Alumni Award. To honor their remarkable lifetime contributions to their industries and disciplines, the school will host a banquet on Nov. 15, 2024, at the Texas A&M Hotel and Conference Center. These individuals represent the top one percent of the top one percent among the school's alumni.

Former students nominated the 2024 Outstanding Alumni, and a school committee selected them for their exceptional achievements. This recognition is the highest honor the school bestows, with less than one percent of its more than 16,000 alumni having received this accolade. **The 2024 Outstanding Alumni are: Jonathan H. Brinsden '91, Brent A. Brown '90, Steve Fitzpatrick '78, Clarence E. (CEM) Maxwell '70, Gary Mitchell '88, Erin K. Peavey '07, and Jim Russ '86.**

Gary Mitchell, FAICP '88 is a foremost practitioner of citywide comprehensive planning, including leading a high-profile Comprehensive Plan for College Station, Texas, in 2007-08. Some 20 years apart, in 1999 and 2019, Mitchell also led significant annexation planning efforts for the City of Bryan, with the latter resulting in long-term protection of Texas A&M University's newly-established RELLIS Campus through Bryan annexing it and its surroundings.

Mitchell is President of Kendig Keast Collaborative, a niche community planning firm based in Sugar Land, that has consulted local governments in 41 states since 1982. His portfolio includes more than 60 plans – in communities ranging from 2,000 to 200,000 people – including cherished Texas towns such as Bastrop, Kerrville and Nacogdoches. His consulting work has taken him to 20 other states in the desert and mountain West, Midwest, Great Lakes region, and Mid-Atlantic and Southeastern U.S.



Prior to his Master of Urban Planning degree from Texas A&M (1988), he earned a bachelor's in economics, with highest honors, at the University of Texas at Austin. He was inducted into Phi Beta Kappa and is a member of the Omicron Delta Epsilon International Honor Society for Economics and Tau Sigma Delta Honor Society for Architecture and Allied Arts. In 2020, Mitchell was inducted into the 600-member College of Fellows of the American Institute of Certified Planners.

Mitchell has served on the College of Architecture's Planning Professional Advisory Council since the early 2000's, recently completing a six-year term as chair. He also lectured within the college, co-teaching a plan implementation course for graduate urban planning students.

Divisions of the American Planning Association (APA) have lauded 14 communities assisted by Mitchell as outstanding examples of urban planning, with awards in Illinois, New Mexico, Texas and Wyoming demonstrating his versatility. He has served as a statewide and regional elected leader of APA.
