From the desk of Pastor Savannah Goodman...

Dear Spring Branch Presbyterian,

I have had the pleasure to teach a Confirmation class with Pastor Mark Plunkett to five of our youth this fall. This class brings me great joy because it feels like a genuine conversation where I always learn something new from each of the youth about being Christian, the church, the world...

Confirmation is a process where young people (typically middle schoolers) affirm their faith and then become members of the church and enter into full participation in the church (e.g. they have voting power at congregational meetings). This process includes a 6-week class, as well as a written personal faith statement, assisting with preparing and cleaning up communion, a mission project, and more. It's a time to explore faith, ask questions, deepen relationships with God and one another, and learn what it means to be a disciple of Jesus Christ in the context of Spring Brach Presbyterian Church and beyond.

Another one of the requirements of Confirmation is to assist in leading a Sunday morning worship service. On Sunday, October 20th, we will celebrate Youth Sunday and honor each of these youth confirmands as worship leaders. These confirmands have put this entire service together and will each take turns leading worship from being acolytes and ushers, to playing musical instruments, to being liturgists, and more! I am so proud of everyone, and I am so excited to see the youth lead worship that day!

After all, we are the church together. We build each other up and we support each other. We teach each other and we learn from each other. We love each other and meet each other where we are. We are all faithful, loving disciples who have something to share. So, let's see what each of the youth have to share with us that day.

I hope y'all will all attend. See you there!

The "Mission of the Month" for October is one of our long-term benevolences – Fair Haven Food Pantry, which has been serving our community since 1975. The Fair Haven Food Pantry is one of the largest private food assistance programs in the greater Houston area. They are completely dependent on the donations of congregations and groups.



Their mission is to provide emergency food

assistance to people in the Spring Branch / Memorial Area, and are currently serving over

2,800 families a MONTH. This pantry is a "Client Choice" experience, where the family in need is able to choose the products they receive. As a benevolence of the church, Fair Haven Food Pantry receives \$3,500 each year in funds to do as they need with it. Along with that, we accept donations throughout the year to help aid this wonderful mission.



During this fall season, please pick up a few extra items each week at the grocery store. When you come to church, place your food in one of the Mission Donation boxes outside of the Church Office. Church members deliver regularly to the Fair Haven Food Pantry! Consider signing up on their website to volunteer. Twenty volunteers are needed each day to sort and restock food, and to help serve the clients. Any children who visit

the pantry are welcome to pick out a book to take home each time they come. Books for all ages of children are always needed. You may bring them to the donation boxes outside the Church Office. Please do not bring ratty or yellowed books. New or gently used books are appreciated.


There are two different anniversary logo options available (pictured above). The *large* size logo is 4.5" x 2.75", and the *small* size logo is 3.5" x 2".
